## From the Principal

Dear Parents and Caregivers

We have had two great days of professional learning either side of the public holiday weekend. Friday 8 March we worked collaboratively with our Walkerville Primary School colleagues on moderating student writing samples, assisting us to build consistency in teaching and learning. Whilst our focus was on moderation we had time in the afternoon to consider our findings and determine what are the next steps for teaching, supporting teams to design learning which is targeted and which will support students to move forward. We will work with our Walkerville colleagues again at next week's staff meeting, week 2 term 2 and again on our next pupil free day in term 3.

On Tuesday our Professional Development focused on STEM using the lens of sustainability. We worked with two parents of our school community who supported our thinking and with whom we look forward to partnering more throughout the year as we journey through the aspects of sustainability starting with our local environments.



On both days our staff were active participants in the learning process and were given the time to begin designing what the learning could look like.

### Road Safety

Parking practices around the perimeter of our school continue to be a safety issue for our students.

A solid yellow line marked on the edge of the road has the same meaning as a **No Stopping sign**. i.e. there is no parking and no standing at any time when next to a yellow line. This is particularly important in the area near the school crossing – stopping there by the yellow line makes it very difficult for the crossing monitors to judge the movement of vehicles approaching the crossing.

It is illegal to 'double park' by stopping next to another car already waiting at the kerb. Double parking restricts access for other traffic, and it requires children to move between waiting cars, some of which reverse as part of their movement away from the kerb. Again, if near the crossing, double parking and the resultant traffic jam along Second Avenue block the vision of the crossing monitors.

We require parents to adhere to the No Standing and No Parking signs, and also to not 'double park' so as to keep our children safe.

We ask everyone to please respect the purpose of the 2 Minute waiting zones. If your child is delayed, circle the block so that other drivers have space to pull into the kerb for their children. Also, keep "moving up" along the kerb so that other cars can come in behind you.

### Reporting Student Progress

It is that time of the term when we prepare for parent/student/teacher interviews to discuss student progress and setting goals. Soon families will be receiving information regarding booking an interview time with your child's teacher/s. Bookings are now made online. Interview week begins Monday 1 April ending Friday 5 April, with one late night being Tuesday 2 April. Please ensure that you make a time in that week unless you are away.

## National Assessment Program Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN)

NAPLAN will commence on Tuesday 14 May and concludes Thursday 16 May with Friday 17 May reserved as a catch up day for students who were absent from school on the previous days of testing.

Day 1 test foci include language conventions and writing

Day 2 test focus is Reading

Day 3 test focus is Numeracy

It is expected that all students in Years 3, 5 and 7 will participate in the NAPLAN tests on each of the three days outlined above.

Students with disabilities whose disability severely limits their capacity to participate may be exempted from sitting the tests.

Other students may be withdrawn from the testing program by parents after consultation with the child's teacher and principal. Withdrawals are intended to address issues such as religious beliefs and philosophical objections to testing.

If you intend on withdrawing your child or seeking an exemption, please see Linda in the Front Office to complete the appropriate forms before Thursday 2 May.

Please note that we strongly support full participation by all students; however, we encourage you to come in and meet with the class teacher and principal to discuss any concerns.

## GASTRO

There have been several case of Gastroenteritis in the school community.

## Start Smart - Financial Literacy Incursion - Reception to Year 7

### Monday 18 March – Friday 22 March 2019

The StartSmart program equips students with the knowledge and confidence to make better money management decisions by delivering workshops that are interactive, engaging and fun! Please note that although our workshops are delivered free of charge, they do not promote the products or services of the Commonwealth Bank. Our goal is improving the financial literacy skills of the next generation!

#### The Workshops

Reception, Year 1 and 2 students begin by consolidating their understanding of the appearance and value of the notes and coins in our currency. They are then taken by 'Money Girl' on a superhero mission to 'Shopville' where they will learn how to determine the difference between needs and wants, helping each other to make better spending choices.

Year 3 and 4 students will be led in a financial fitness workshop by 'Coach Cash' who introduces them to money management skills such as understanding credit and key cards, the importance of comparative shopping, the effect of advertising, as well as a more nuanced look at needs and wants.
